

Understanding Vaccines by Ketti Walker RN

Since vaccines were invented, the number of babies and adults who get sick or die from vaccine preventable diseases has gone way down, and some diseases have been wiped out altogether in the USA.

What vaccines do we have?

Chickenpox (Varicella) * Yellow Fever Cholera Meningococcal COVID-19 Mumps *

Diphtheria * Pneumococcal * Flu (Influenza) * Polio *

Hepatitis A * Rabies
Hepatitis B * Rotavirus *

Hib (Haemophilus Influenzae Type B) * Rubella *

HPV(Human Papillomavirus) Shingles Japanese Encephalitis (JE) Tetanus *

Measles * Whooping Cough *

*14 diseases you almost forgot about thanks to vaccines.

Getting vaccinated is one of the best ways we get protected from potentially harmful diseases. Most people today (except for our new pandemic Covid-19) have never seen first -hand the devastating consequences that vaccine-preventable diseases have on a child, a family, or community. Immunization is a powerful defense that's safe, proven, and effective.

It may be helpful to understand the difference between vaccines, vaccinations, and immunization. A <u>vaccine</u> has historically been made from very small amounts of weak or dead germs that cause diseases, for example, viruses, bacteria, or toxins. It prepares your body to fight the disease faster and more effectively, so you won't get sick. A <u>vaccination</u> is the act of getting a vaccine, usually as a shot. <u>Immunization</u> is the process of becoming immune to (protected against) a disease.

Vaccines do a great job of keeping people from getting serious diseases. In the United Sates, the rates for most vaccine-preventable diseases are at record or near record lows. But these diseases still exist, even if they are rare in the United States, they may be common in countries that are just a plane ride away. As long as these diseases are around, people will continue to get sick. That is why it's so important for you and your family to get vaccinated.

The coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic disrupted our lives and healthcare systems and accounted for millions of illnesses across the globe ranging from mild to severe to deadly. COVID-19 vaccination is a critical tool in stopping this pandemic. Millions of people in the United States have received COVID-19 vaccines. These vaccines have undergone the most intensive safety monitoring in the U.S. history and were found to be both safe and effective, using a new method using mRNA, not the virus in any form. These two vaccines require two doses. The first shot starts building protection. A second shot a few weeks later is needed to get the most protection the vaccine has to offer. It is unknown at this time if a yearly booster will be needed.

Common questions:

- Are COVID-19 vaccines safe? COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective. Millions of people in the USA have received COVID-19 vaccines under the most intense safety monitoring in U.S. history.
- Who should not get a COVID-19 vaccine? If you had a severe allergic reaction after a previous dose of the vaccine or had a severe allergic reaction to any ingredients of the vaccine.
- Can Covid-19 vaccine affect future pregnancy? There is no evidence that they do, according to ACOG and SMFM.
- Should you get vaccines if you have an autoimmune disease? There is no data currently available on the safety of COVID-19 vaccines for people with autoimmune conditions.

The concept of community immunity, or herd immunity is as follows. Germs Enjoy your summer!

can travel quickly through a community and make a lot of people sick. If enough people get sick, it can lead to an outbreak. But when enough people are vaccinated against a certain disease, the germs can't travel as easily from person to person-and the entire community is less likely to get the disease. That means even people who can't get vaccinated will have some protection from getting sick. And if a person does get sick, there's less chance of an outbreak because it's harder for the disease to spread. Eventually, the disease becomes rare-and sometimes, it's wiped out altogether.

Thank you, former President Donald Trump and Melania in January 2021 for showing the way and getting vaccinated against the pandemic when you showed positive for the virus. At the Conservative Political Action Conference in Orlando, Florida, Trump told the audience, "How unpainful that vaccine shot is, so everybody go get your shot". By March President Biden compelled state, local, and tribal governments to make all American adults eligible to sign up for Covid-19 vaccines no later than May1.

Now days you can go get a vaccine with little to no difficulty, and it is free. With so many getting vaccinated our state and country is slowly coming out of a very difficult time. With everyone working together, we can get back to going out and about without hurting (exposing) ourselves or others to now a preventable situation. Wear a mask when recommended (not for you but for others), wash your hands, and get vaccinated.
