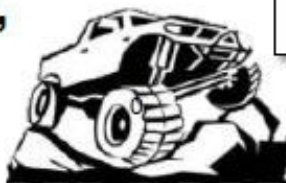

Dear Camas Valley,

That we can show them what understanding, grace, and community look like. Some people have told me, not possible, but I refuse to believe that. As we start the school year, I hope we can come together and work through all the issues and, in June, look back and be able to say what a great year!

Library staff will pull requested items from the shelves and check them out to patrons.

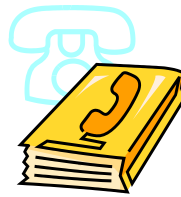

Yes, the Dillard-Winston Food Pantry is alive...

and very operational for low income residents in **Winston, Dillard, Tenmile, Camas Valley and Green**. At the end of February as several of us watched the Winston Nazarene Church go up in flames and with it the Food Pantry, we wondered what was in store for us. But our communities are wonderful. The City of Winston responded to our request to use the pavilion at Riverbend Park; the Festival Association rearranged their kitchen for our use as well as letting us use their freezers and refrigerators. We received two used refrigerators, two small chest freezers and one supporter even purchased a new upright freezer for us. Food drives at Bi-Mart and Winston Grocery Outlet plus individuals gave donations of food. Lots of muscle got the pantry set up. The four days later, we were open for clients - only missed one day.

We have tried to pass the word that we are in the Riverbend Park Pavilion on Thompson Street until we can find a permanent home. Our hours are still the same - **9:30 to 11:30 Mondays and Wednesdays and 4:30 p.m. on the first and third Wednesday afternoons**. We have ample food and locals are being generous with their excess garden produce. (Camas Valley residents with extra produce and fruit can contact **Vonnie Wallace at 541-445 2355**. It can be delivered to her or let her know you are leaving it at the CV Post Office Thursdays through Sundays.)

Our board has increased the number of times a year to 15 that clients can get a food box - up to twice a month. Camas Valley residents, you can use the Mobile Pantry at Camas or the Dillard-Winston Food Pantry. We would love to see your smiling faces behind your masks!
